

JA FINANCE PARK (ENTRY) Traditional Curriculum

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

JA Finance Park (Entry) helps students build a foundation upon which they can make intelligent lifelong financial decisions, including those related to income, expenses, savings, and credit. The JA Finance Park traditional curriculum, designed for 7th-9th grade students, is composed of 13 required teachertaught, in-class lessons. It culminates in a hands-on budgeting simulation that is implemented at JA Finance Park presented by Truist.



TRADITIONAL CURRICULUM

- Unit One: Income (three 45-minute lessons)
 Students recognize the fundamental role of income in managing their personal finances and the factors that affect income and take-home pay. They will understand that the decisions they make about education and careers will have an impact on their potential income and quality of life.
- Unit Two: Savings, Investing, and Risk
 Management (two 45-minute lessons)
 Students explore saving and compare investments
 as part of their overall financial planning. They also
 examine risk and how insurance may help protect
 savings.
- Unit Three: Debit and Credit (four 45-minute lessons)
 Students compare financial institutions and their services. Through discussion and a game activity, they weigh the advantages and disadvantages of debit and credit. Students also examine how credit
 - debit and credit. Students also examine how credit scores and credit reporting affect personal finances.
- Unit Four: Budget+ (three 45-minute lessons)
 Students discover the importance of spending money wisely and recognize a budget as a valuable tool. They create personal budgets based on savings and lifestyle goals and day-to-day situations.
- Unit Five: Simulation (4 hours)
 Students spend the day at JA Finance Park, where they work with iPads and community volunteers to apply classroom learning by creating a family budget based on a hypothetical life situation.
 Students recognize the impact of credit history, savings and debt on budget planning and purchasing options.
- Unit Six: Debrief (one 45-minute lesson)
 After the JA Finance Park simulation, students participate in a reflective assessment of their accomplishments.

ADDITIONAL RESOURCES

JA Finance Park is very flexible. While the program length is a minimum of 13 classroom hours and 4 sitevisit hours, the optional extension activities can provide up to 21 extra hours to meet classroom needs. Teachers receive an easy-to-use teacher guide with detailed lesson plans, and every student receives a workbook.
